## Learning objectives

At the end of this activity you should be able to:

- Identify key features of sociological perspectives on families and social policy.
- Evaluate perspectives, highlighting strengths and limitations of each one.
- Apply perspectives to the impact of social policy on family life.
- A. Divide into four groups. Each group will adopt one perspective on the family and social policy: functionalist, conflict (Donzelot), New Right or feminist.
