- 2. Because traditional norms about relationships weaken and individuals become free to pursue their own self-interest. Marriages thus become more fragile, because individuals become unwilling to remain with a partner if the relationship fails to deliver personal fulfilment.

- 4. Any one of the following: the increase in separation and divorce; the decline in the numbers marrying; the trend towards marrying later; more people choosing to live alone; too few partners available in some age groups.
