Reintegrative shaming

## **Learning objectives**

At the end of this activity you should be able to:

- Identify features of reintegrative shaming.
- Analyse the process of reintegrative shaming using case studies.
- Evaluate the effectiveness of reintegrative shaming as a means dealing with offenders.
